MEMBER PROFILE (Sigrid D Houlette CMA, Aroostook Regional Assessing Office)

I have worn many hats in many different parts of the country and abroad to include a data base manager for a California prison; a banquet manager for the Sheraton in Anchorage, AK; a Solid Waste Manager for the City of Lower Hutt in New Zealand; an Environmental Planner for the Northern Maine Development Commission; and many different restaurants waitressing and bartending. I also completed my Code Enforcement and Licensed Plumbing Inspection courses and worked in that field for a while, yet never thought I'd be doing what I am now. My current hat/ job as an assessor began when Lewis Cousins asked if I'd be interested in working with him on a contract basis for a 3-year grant project. The Aroostook Regional Assessing Office was initiated to assist the towns in Aroostook with assessing services as there was/is a lack of assessors in the County. Lewis and I had met many years ago when I was wearing my CEO/LPI hat for the town of Stockholm. I chose not to continue with code work for various reasons and I was in between jobs at the time of his request as the COVID restrictions had closed the restaurant that I had been working for. I didn't really know anything about assessing, but was willing to give it a try as long as I could work part-time with flexible hours.

My full-time job is being mom to two teen age boys, one of which I continue to home school, and the other who recently became a father. Along with their father, Kurt, we all live and work on our family farm. We grow the majority

of our food and keep dairy cows, pigs, chickens, ducks and have two teams of draft horses. I can't forget our resident mouser, Obsidian, or our watch dog, Schultz. We make most of our hay and are trying to find a way to process feed grains as the costs have skyrocketed! We heat our home with wood which we cut from our forest stands. We also have a saw mill and Kurt cuts his own timbers for timber frame structures that he builds in his spare time. I've always put these responsibilities first in my life. Lewis has, thankfully, been very accommodating in that regard.

In August 2021 I attended tax school via zoom and after two attempts at the exam I received my CMA in November 2021. I enjoy researching and processing deed transfers, working with the parcel maps and getting out and about to the properties in various towns following up on building permits. The variety of the work keeps me interested and I appreciate the opportunity to continue learning new things on a regular basis. We completed the grant project last year yet a number of the towns that we had been working for requested that we continue providing assessing services. In Feb of this year the City of Presque Isle took me on as a part-time employee where I continue to enjoy working with Lewis and Marria as well. I recently used one of my other hats for the cities wellness program where I offered an introduction to yoga. I currently teach 4 different yoga classes per week which helps to balance all areas of my life.

- 3) The Committee shall not disclose the name of the recipient before the Awards Ceremony.
- 4) The Award will be given during the MAAO Fall Conference Annual meeting in September.

Criteria:

- 1) Nominee must hold the title of Assessor for his/her municipality and be a current CMA.
- 2) Nominee provides service and contribution beyond just that of the municipality in which he/she serves by active participation in various Assessing organizations.
- 3) Quality and consistency of work product
- 4) Nominee is recognized as an Assessor who displays characteristics of integrity and leadership.
- 5) Nominee shall have at least three years experience as an Assessor.
- 6) Nominee is not eligible if they have been a previous recipient of the Assessor of the Year Award.
